

## ACTION IN CASE OF FIRE

### SAVE AND RESCUE

- If possible, rescue others in immediate danger.
- Go to a safe place yourself.
- Do not use the lift.
- If there is smoke in the room, move low.
- **Avoid moving in smoky areas.** If the fire is in a neighboring apartment and there is smoke in the stairwell, stay in your own apartment and close the doors leading to the staircase.
- Express your location to rescuers.
- Ventilate your own apartment if necessary.

### MAKE AN EMERGENCY CALL

- Call **the emergency number 112** from a safe place.
- If possible, inform the neighbors, first the inhabitants of the upper side.

### EXTINGUISH AND LIMIT

- Extinguish the fire with the nearest first-aid extinguishing equipment.
- Limit the fire by closing the doors, windows, and air conditioning.
- Remember to also close the door to your apartment to prevent fire and smoke from spreading.

### GUIDE RESCUE UNITS TO THE SCENE

- If possible, arrange for people at intersections to guide rescue units to the correct way to the scene of the accident.
- Ensure unhindered access to the immediate vicinity of the accident site.
- Please note that there are usually several rescue units arriving at the site. Therefore, do not leave after the first unit to guide.

### PREPARING IN ADVANCE FOR A POSSIBLE FIRE SITUATION

- ✓ Make sure you have a **working smoke alarm in your home** 1 pcs / 60 m<sup>2</sup> and maintain its working condition, run the test once a month and change the battery once a year.
- ✓ At home, draw up instructions with your family in case of danger and teach family members to act as instructed.
- ✓ Make sure you know how to make an emergency call.
- ✓ Make sure you know your emergency escape route. It can be through the balcony and windows.
- ✓ Learn how to seal your apartment and close ventilation units. Sealed objects: ventilation valves in the kitchen, bathroom and walk-in closet, doors and windows, entrance door, mail hatch.
- ✓ Get and learn how to use first-aid extinguishing equipment.
- ✓ Keep emergency routes clear. Make sure rescue vehicles have unobstructed access next to the building and there are no extra items in the stairwells.
